

2017 Indicative Domestic Fees

At The University of Notre Dame Australia your tuition fees vary depending upon your course and the subjects you take within that course. All subjects are allocated a study load and a discipline area. The fees shown in this document are indicative of a full time study load in the specified discipline areas. Fees will vary based on the number and type of units chosen. Courses that have an overload component will attract higher annual fees. How fees are calculated

Fees are calculated based on the discipline and study load of the units undertaken by students. For the majority of courses, units studied do not all fall within the same discipline. For example, if you are enrolled in a Bachelor of Education, you may undertake some units of study that are classified as 'education' and some that are classified as 'humanities'. In this example your student contribution for the humanities units will be calculated against the Humanities discipline, while the education units will be calculated against the Education discipline.

Pre-University Courses

Students undertaking the Tertiary Preparation Program or the Foundation Year courses, and who are awarded a Commonwealth Supported Place, will pay **NO FEES**. Students undertaking one of the Foundation Year courses, and who are awarded a Fee Paying place, will pay between \$10,120 and \$11,859 depending upon the stream chosen.

Commonwealth Supported Places

The following discipline rates apply to all students awarded a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP). Subject to availability it is expected that most students enrolled in Education (pre-service), Health & Physical Education, Health Sciences, Medicine, Nursing and Physiotherapy will be allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place. These fees are aligned with the student contribution rates set by the Australian Government.

The following discipline rates apply to all students awarded a domestic fee paying place, and are based upon a full time study load in the discipline area.

The following rates apply to all students awarded a domestic research place. Please note domestic student research fees are normally covered by the Research Training Program (RTP) fee offset scholarship.

How will I pay?

Students who are Australian Citizens, holders of Permanent Humanitarian Visas and eligible New Zealand Citizens who wish to defer their fees, have access to the Australian Government's HELP loan schemes HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP. The HECS-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students, who have been allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place, in paying their tuition fees. The FEE-HELP loan scheme assists eligible students, who have been allocated a Fee Paying Place, in paying their tuition fees. Repayments in both schemes can be deferred until students are in the workforce. Students should consult www.studyassist.gov.au for further information and up to date eligibility requirements.

These fees are indicative and may vary with the mix of units selected. Fee levels vary from year to year and the University makes no guarantee that the current fee levels will be maintained in future.
