1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Course Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Bachelor of Nursing Award at The University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Course Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Bachelor of Nursing Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

The Bachelor of Nursing Award is available on the Sydney Campus only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Bachelor of Nursing Award is an AQF qualification Level 7.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

The standard entry requirements for admission are detailed in the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing Regulations.

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

The following entry requirements apply to this Award:

- Enrolled Nurses who have completed either the Diploma of Nursing or Certificate IV in Nursing in the previous 5 years and are registered with AHPRA may be eligible for advanced standing
- English Language Requirements
 The International English Language testing System (IELTS) requirements for international students seeking admission to the Bachelor of Nursing offered on the Sydney campus is an overall score of 7 with a minimum score of 7 in all categories. These requirements also extend to permanent residents and new Australian citizens who did not complete their secondary education to the requisite level required for entry into the nursing program.
- Evidence of compliance with NSW Health Policy Directive: Clinical Placements in NSW PD2013_015

2.3 External Accreditation Requirements

The Bachelor of Nursing is externally accredited by Australian Nursing and Midwifery Accreditation Council.

3.6 Volume of Learning

3.6.1 Standard Duration

- (a) The standard duration for the Bachelor of Nursing Award is three (3) years of equivalent full-time study.
- (b) A student is able to enroll in this Award on a part-time basis.

3.6.2 Accelerated Duration

An accelerated mode is not available for the Bachelor of Nursing Award.

3.6.3 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Bachelor of Nursing Award is 8 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Bachelor of Nursing as detailed in the Course Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.

3.8 Exit Awards

An Exit Award pathway is not available for this Award.

3.9 Honours

The Bachelor of Nursing Award is not offered with Honours.
