HPE3503 Sport and Recreation Management Industry Internship

(d) Placements are managed and authorised by the Practicum Coordinator and require students to formally register and seek approval on the standard form for the placement with the coordinator prior to commencement.

(e) For the Bachelor of Sport and Recreation Management double degree component, a lower level Practicum unit must be completed prior to enrolment in a higher level practicum unit unless permission is granted by the Dean of the School of Business.

### **3.4 Approved unit substitutions**

- a) Unit substitutions within the Bachelor of Sport and Recreation Management component of the double degree are permitted only with the approval of the Dean (or delegate).
- b) Unit substitutions within the Bachelor of Science component of the double degree are permitted only with the approval of the Dean (or delegate).

### **3.5 Alternative Pathways**

Alternative Pathways are not applicable for this Award.

### **3.6 Volume of Learning**

#### **3.6.1 Standard Duration**

- (a) The standard duration for the Bachelor of Sport and Recreation Management / Bachelor of Science Award is four (4.0) years of equivalent full-time study.
- (b) A student is able to enrol in this Award on a part-time basis.

#### **3.6.2 Accelerated Duration**
