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1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Course Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Bachelor of Education Studies Award at The University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's General Regulations and the School of Education Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Education Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Course Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Bachelor of Education Studies Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

The Bachelor of Education Studies Award is available on the Sydney Campus only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Bachelor of Education Studies Award is an AQF level 7 qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

This is an Exit Award only as detailed in the University of Notre Dame Australia *Policy: Exit Awards*.

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

Entry to this degree requires successful completion of a minimum of 600 credit points of the parent degrees, Bachelor of Primary Education, Bachelor of Education (Religious Education) or the Bachelor of Education (Birth to Twelve), See Chapter 3 of these Regulations.

2.2 External Accreditation Requirements

External accreditation requirements are not applicable to this Award.

3 AWARD REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure

Following the University of Notre Dame Australia *Policy: Exit Awards*, students complete 600 credit points from the Bachelor of Primary Education which has a total credit point value of 800, the Bachelor of Primary Education (Religious Education) or the Bachelor of Education (Birth to Twelve Years), each of which have a total credit point value of 900. This is equivalent to three years of full-time study. The units students transfer into the Bachelor of Education Studies are made up as follows:

At least 525 credit points from Education units within Bachelor of Primary Education, the Bachelor of Primary Education (Religious Education) or the Bachelor of Education (Birth to Twelve Years) degree.

In transferring from the Bachelor of Primary Education, the Bachelor of Primary Education (Religious Education) or the Bachelor of Education (Birth to Twelve Years) degree, students may include a maximum of 125 credit points from entry level (100 level) units, in addition to 75 credit points from Logos units. The remaining credit points must be made up as follows: 200 credit points from 200 level units and 200 credit points from 300 level units. In meeting this requirement, any units offered in the parent degree may be used by students when transferring to the Exit Award. [See Course Regulations: Bachelor of Primary Education, the Bachelor of Primary Education (Religious Education) and Bachelor of Education (Birth to Twelve Years)]. Thus, students meet the AQF Level 7 specification of no more than a third of the units being entry level units.

3.6.3 Maximum Duration

This is an Exit Award only, from the parent degrees listed above.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Bachelor of Education Studies Award as detailed in these Course Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.

3.8 Exit Awards

An Exit Award pathway is not available for this Award.

3.9 Honours

The Bachelor of Education Studies Award is not offered with Honours.
