Commencing Students Fremantle and Broome

Tuition

Tuition costs depend upon study load. An average study load is 8 units per year or 4 units per semester. Science, Education, Health and Law courses attract higher fees and more unit variation by semester. The tuition fees may change in subsequent years. All fees for the first year are to be paid four weeks before the start of semester. The University does not offer instalments or extensions.

Living Expenses

As a general guide, you could expect to spend around AU\$250 to AU\$350 per week on living expenses, not including tuition fees or accommodation. Living expenses include food, transport, entertainment, books and other items such as clothing and depends on your individual needs. Including accommodation costs, you need to allow an average of between AU\$400 to AU\$600 per week to cover your cost of living. This totals between AU\$20,800 and AU\$31,200 for a **calendar year**. An **academic year** of 40 weeks will average between AU\$16,000 and AU\$24,000 for total living costs.

Health Cover

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) administered by the Worldcare health fund, provides basic health cover to international students and their families while residing in Australia. This covers a portion of doctor's fees, treatment in public hospitals and emergency ambulance transfer. Top-up cover for ancillaries such as dental and optical is also available. This health cover is compulsory for international students whilst in Australia. Students will receive an invoice with their tuition fee invoice.

Student Visa

A visa is required for non-residents to study in Australia. Upon receiving a place at Notre Dame, students may apply for a visa through the local Australian Embassy or High Commission, and some IDP offices. A medical examination is required before a visa application is approved. A student visa will be valid for the duration of the course provided students remain enrolled full-time, health cover is kept up to date and students maintain a current address with the University. The visa application fee is approximately AU\$565.

Students are generally allowed to work under the terms of their Student Visa for a total of 20 hours per week during semester and longer during non-contact weeks and holidays.

Accommodation Costs

Accommodation costs will vary depending on the types of arrangement chosen - residential college, shared apartment, homestay, living alone in rented accommodation or staying with relatives. Sharing a room in a house will cost approximately AU\$150-200 per week excluding amenities (bills). Full board and lodging costs approximately AU\$220 - AU\$250 per week. Rented accommodation will range from \$200 upwards depending on size and location. Students may be liable for a bond (usually four weeks rent) which is refundable upon departure. A University accommodation service is available upon request.
