



Academic Scholarships 2005

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The University of Notre Dame recognises outstanding academic achievement by awarding academic scholarships. The scholarships take two forms:

Founders' Scholarships

These are tenable for the duration of the nominated student's degree and cover 100% of tuition costs.

University Scholarships

These are tenable for the duration of the nominated student's degree and cover 10%-85% of tuition costs.

Academic Scholarships are reserved for students who submit an **Application for Admission** during Year Twelve for an undergraduate degree course at Notre Dame. The application must be received at the University no later than 4:00pm on Thursday 30 September 2004. Scholarships will only be awarded to those students who have satisfied Notre Dame's rigorous admission requirements and who have been offered a place in their nominated course.

Due to the difficulty associated with the non-standardised results of mature-age applicants, the University is unable to offer Academic Scholarships to non-School Leaver applicants.

A student's Tertiary Entrance Rank (TER) will be the deciding factor in the short listing of candidates for scholarships. Winners of a General Exhibition in the Curriculum Council Awards will be considered for Founders' Scholarships. University Scholarships will be offered to students who have achieved an outstanding TER but who have not been awarded a General Exhibition. Students who have been awarded Subject Exhibitions or other Curriculum Council Awards will also be highly regarded.

Generally, students with TER's below 97.00 will not be short listed. The University reserves the right to take into account personal qualities, leadership achievements and exceptional circumstances when making its decision.

Students wishing to be considered for scholarships should submit their **Application for Admission** by **Thursday 30 September**. This is the final date for applications to be considered in the first round of offers for places in courses at Notre Dame.

SCHOOL OF NURSING

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION

The Department of Education and Training offers scholarships to students completing the final year of a teaching degree, ie. Graduate Diploma in Education or Bachelor of Education and who are committed to working for the Department in learning and geographical areas of need. Two scholarships that are available are:

Mathematics and Physical Sciences 2004

Scholarships worth up to \$20,000 each will be offered to people who are completing their final year of a teaching degree in 2004 and who will be qualified to teach mathematics or physical sciences. Recipients of these scholarships also receive a contract of up to three years to work with the Department in a rural school.

Learning Areas of Need 2004

Scholarships worth up to \$10,000 each will be offered to people who are completing their final year of a teaching degree in 2004 and who will be qualified to teach home economics, design and technology, Indonesian, Japanese or special needs education.

Recipients will receive a contract of up to two years to work in a government school in a rural area.
