



# Teaching – Italian Teaching Method

2009

## INTRODUCTION

The University of Notre Dame Australia and the Italo-Australian Welfare & Cultural Centre Inc (IAWCC) with the support of the Italian Consul in Perth are offering four specialist units in Italian Teaching Method for staff currently working for IAWCC and others wishing to work for IAWCC as specialist Italian teachers in Primary (K-7) or Middle schools (6-10).

## COURSE OUTLINE

The four Italian Teaching Method Units are offered to current Notre Dame students as a specialisation pathway within the Bachelor of Education course which is run over 4 years. Each unit requires 4 contact hours per week, comprising of 2 hours on in-depth study of the Italian Language and 2 hours of 'hands on' teaching methodology, with emphasis placed on Outcomes Based Education.

The course is based on the 6 LOTE outcomes as outlined in the Curriculum Framework. The first three units focus on the first three sequenced LOTE outcomes. Unit four covers the three unsequenced LOTE outcomes.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Normally, to be allowed entry into this course pathway, students must have completed as a minimum, Year 12 Italian language study or equivalent.

**Bachelor of Education** students may take the four units as a specialisation pathway. Other degree students may take one or more of the units as electives.

**Not for degree** students are enrolled without having to meet normal university entrance requirements, but may not transfer this enrolment to any other university course without first satisfying such requirements.

Students wishing to gain entry into the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree course must meet the minimum entry requirements as stipulated in the Admission Guide.

Those who are successful in gaining entry will be given Advanced Standing for the Italian Teaching Method units which they have completed.

All students who complete the course will be awarded a Certificate by the IAWCC, recognising them as "specialist" teachers of Italian in primary and middle school.

**It should be noted that a completion of these four units does not provide a teaching qualification as such. To qualify as a registered teacher for registration with WACOT, a four year Bachelor of Education or a one year Graduate Diploma of Education is required.**

## MODE OF STUDY & ASSESSMENT

Study will be undertaken on the Fremantle Campus of the University. Assessment will be via assignments, portfolio and examination.
