INTRODUCTION

This program has been designed to provide nurses working in the specialty area of haematology, an avenue to consolidate their knowledge and apply new skills to their practice. The course has been developed as a result of an articulated need by nurses working in this specialty area. The Graduate Diploma in Haematology Nursing consists of eight units of study which includes an UNDA core unit. It is anticipated that the course will take two years to complete. Students will be able to exit with a Graduate Certificate after one year upon successful completion of four units of study. The Haematology course also articulates with the Master of Nursing.

The program is aimed at enabling the registered nurse to develop knowledge and skills to function as a specialist within the Haematology field. It is also aimed at providing currently practising Haematology nurses with opportunities to advance their own practice.

COURSE OUTLINE

The course timetable will take into consideration the working requirements of the majority of individuals enrolling in the course. To qualify with a Graduate Diploma in Haematology, the participants will need to undertake the following units of study, plus one additional core unit:

Pathophysiology of Haematological Conditions A
Pathophysiology of Haematological Conditions B
Haematology and Malignant Diseases
Haematology and Non-malignant Diseases
Bone Marrow Transplants
Thrombophilia
Treatment Modalities

Please note the course sequence and unit titles may be subject to change.

MODE OF STUDY & ASSESSMENT

Students should discuss their study program with the course coordinator before commencing. The assessment of each unit is variable and may consist of tutorial presentations, case study, written assignments, projects and journals.
