CHAPTER 1: INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Bachelor of Education (Primary) Degree Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree at the University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the General University Regulations and the School of Education Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Education Regulations.

1.3 Alternations made to Course Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree, the amendments will automatically apply to all students enrolling for the first time in the degree in the year immediately following the adoption of the amendments.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

These Regulations for the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree apply for the Fremantle Campus only.

CHAPTER 2: ENTRY CRITERIA

The standard entry criteria as detailed in the General Regulations apply to this course.

CHAPTER 3: DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure (Appendix A)

3.1.1 Compulsory units

Compulsory units within the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree are listed in Appendix A.

3.1.2 Elective units

A student must complete one elective unit within the Bachelor of Education (Primary). This elective may be chosen from any School of the University providing that:

- (a) the selection of the units is made in consultation with the Dean of the School (or delegate); and
- (b) any pre requisites for the selected elective units have been satisfied.

3.1.3 Majors/Double Majors

A student can select a Major in either Numeracy or Literacy within the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree, the requirements of such are specified in Appendix C.

3.1.4 Minors

There are no Minors available within the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree.

3.1.5 Specialisations

A student may choose to undertake a specialisation within the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree as specified in Appendix B.

3.2 Practicum or Internship requirements

- (a) The following practicum/internship requirements form part of the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree:

- ED1394 Classroom Immersion (2 continuous weeks in duration)
- ED2394 School Experience I (10 continuous weeks in duration)
- ED3394 School Experience II (10 continuous weeks in duration)
- ED4391 Teaching Internship (10 continuous weeks in duration)

- (b) Prior to the commencement of the first practicum, a student enrolled in the Bachelor of Education (Primary) course must have submitted to the School of Education a copy of a police clearance (*CrimTrack* for Fremantle Campus).
- (c) At the time of the first practicum, a student who is enrolled in the Bachelor of Education (Primary) course must have completed and submitted to the School of Education the required documentation for obtaining a *Working with Children* clearance.

3.3 Approved unit substitutions

Approved unit substitutes pertaining to Accreditation requirements within the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree are listed in Appendix A.

3.4 Course duration

3.4.1 Standard Duration

- (i) The standard duration of the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree is four years of full time study.
- (ii) Students are able to enrol in the degree on a part-time basis.
- (iii) The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree is ten years from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.

3.4.2 Accelerated Duration

An accelerated mode is not available for the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree.

3.5 Graduation

A minimum of 1000 credit points drawn from the approved course structure is required in order for a student to graduate with the degree Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree.

3.6 Honours

There is no honours year associated with the Bachelor of Education (Primary) degree.

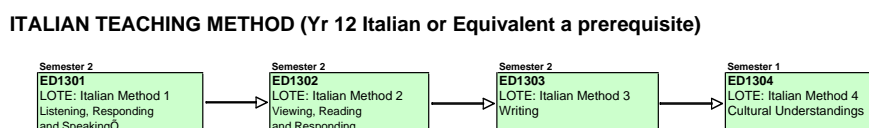
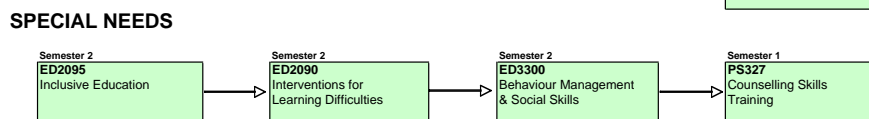
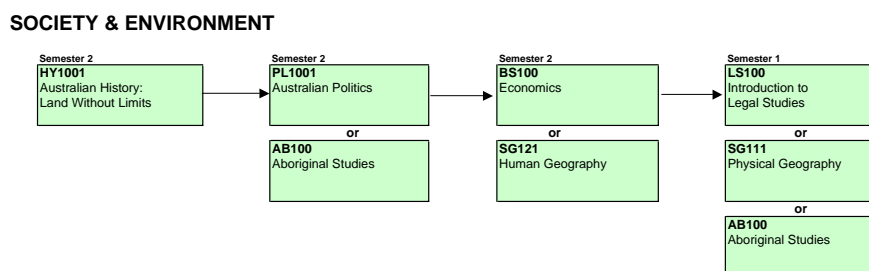
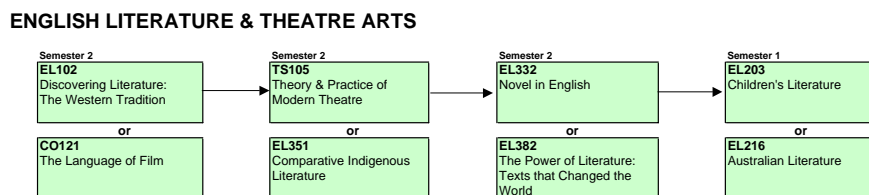
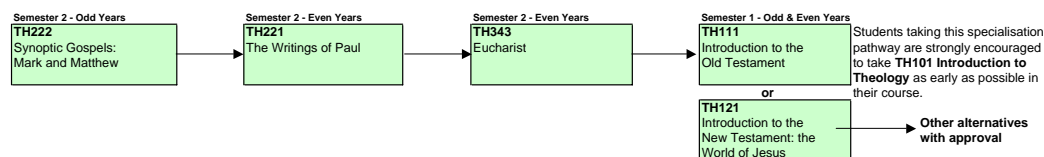
SPECIALISATION PATHWAYS FOR BEd PRIMARY
