- Submitted abstracts must be between 500 – 1000 words in length
- Accepted speakers will be given 30 minutes to present, and 15 minutes of Q&A
- Submitted abstracts must be received as .doc or .docx or .pdf files
- Abstracts must be received by **19 July 2017**
